### Classroom Presentations

Presentations are designed to support grade level state curriculum standards and will assist students in discovering basic water concepts. All classes cover grade appropriate information on water sources, source protection and conservation. In addition, individual grade level presentations address:

- 4th Grade: California's water history.
- 5th Grade: Earth's fresh water supply, the water cycle and drinking water treatment.
- 6th Grade: Water as a material resource and how it is used to make common objects.

All classroom programs are offered at no cost to participating schools within the TPWD service area. Presentations are approximately 60 minutes and include a combination of short videos, discussion and classroom activities.

### About the Twentynine Palms Water District

The mission of the TPWD is to provide a safe and adequate supply of water at the lowest feasible cost to the people of the district and to preserve and protect the water resources within the established boundaries of the district.

The TPWD serves the city of Twentynine Palms as well as outlying areas by pumping and distributing local groundwater - the only available supply. The TPWD serves a population of approximately 17,000 within an 87 square mile area.

The TPWD is dedicated to educating our youth about the importance of protecting our public water supply. These programs emphasize:

- Recognizing activities that could affect water quality.
- Understanding the connection between health and water quality.
- The need for water conservation.
