BACKGROUND

Staff presented to the Board a Draft Employee and Family Emergency Plan (Plan) at the July 27, 2016 Board Meeting.

In the event of a declared emergency all District employees become Disaster Service Workers and must report to work. District management understands that this will be a difficult and stressful requirement for employees during an emergency and recognizes the need to address the concerns that are associated with this obligation. The purpose of this Plan is to provide supplies to the employees to help ensure the safety and wellbeing of their families during emergency situations. This function is an imperative element of the Emergency Response Plan in which it will allow the employee to report to work with assurance that their family is secure.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommendation is to approve Resolution 16-12 adopting an Employee and Family Emergency Plan.

RESOLUTION 16-12

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE TWENTYNINE PALMS WATER DISTRICT ADOPTING AN EMPLOYEE/FAMILY EMERGENCY PLAN

WHEREAS, the Twentynine Palms Water District recognizes the threat that disasters pose to people and property within our service area and have developed an Employee and Family Emergency Plan, a copy which is attached as Exhibit A;

WHEREAS, understanding emergency actions will reduce potential for harm to people and property from future disaster occurrences;

WHEREAS, all employees of the Twentynine Palms Water District are employees of Local Government; therefore all employees must report to work in the event of a disaster;

WHEREAS, an Employee and Family Emergency Plan will help ensure staff and families are taken care of in a disaster;

WHEREAS, the safety and well-being of the employees and their families in emergency situations is imperative to the function and operations of the Twentynine Palms Water District;

WHEREAS, it is important for staff to have peace of mind during emergencies that their family is safe;

WHEREAS, the Twentynine Palms Water District understands that the potential sheltering of families during an emergency will only be until the County of San Bernardino, City of Twentynine Palms, FEMA or other State or Federal entity opens an Evacuation Center. At that time family members will be moved to the Evacuation Center;

WHEREAS, adoption of this Resolution validates the plan and authorizes staff to carry out their responsibilities under the plan; and,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Board of Directors hereby adopts the Employee and Family Emergency Plan as a component of the Emergency Response Plan.
- 2. The Board of Directors hereby appoints the General Manager, or his/her successor or his/her designee to execute elements of the plan.

EXHIBIT "A"

TWENTYNINE PALMS WATER DISTRICT EMPLOYEE AND FAMILY EMERGENCY PLAN

The Twentynine Palms Water District, Board of Directors recognize the importance of having a plan in place, that will ensure the welfare of all the employees of the District and the welfare of all the employee's direct family members.

The safety and well-being of the employees and their families in emergency situations is imperative to the function and operations of the Twentynine Palms Water District.

In disasters, no matter the size or complexity, staff must know that their family is safe and being taken care of in order for the employee to function in his or her duties for the District. Therefore, the Board of Directors has adopted this plan as part of the Emergency Response Plan

All employees of the Twentynine Palms Water District are employees of Local Government; therefore, all employees are under California Law and are considered Disaster Service Workers. All employees must report to work in any disaster. If any employee fails to report to the nearest governmental office, the worker can be terminated

In the event Twentynine Palms Water District, the City of Twentynine Palms, the County of San Bernardino, or the State of California declares an emergency, all public employees are obligated to serve as Disaster Service Workers (DSWs). As DSWs, public employees may be assigned to perform activities which promote the protection of public health and safety or the preservation of lives and property. Disaster Service Worker requirements are designated by Government Code 3100 – 3102 and Labor Codes 3211.92 (b).

- Public employees include all state, county, city and local government employees.
- DSWs provide services and aid during a declared emergency, disaster or catastrophic event.
- At any time during a declared emergency you are required to report to work and you may be assigned to disaster service work.
- As a DSW, you may be assigned to locations and duties outside of your normal job responsibilities.

The government code is recited below:

"3100. It is hereby declared that the protection of the health and safety and preservation of the lives and property of the people of the state from the effects of natural, manmade, or war-caused emergencies which result in conditions of disaster or in extreme peril to life, property, and resources is of paramount state importance requiring the responsible efforts of public and private agencies and individual citizens. In furtherance of the exercise of the police power of the state in protection of its citizens and resources, all public employees are hereby declared to be disaster service workers subject to such disaster service activities as may be assigned to them by their superiors or by law.

- 3101. For the purpose of this chapter the term "disaster service worker" includes all public employees and all volunteers in any disaster council or emergency organization accredited by the Office of Emergency Services. The term "public employees" includes all persons employed by the state or any county, city, city and county, state agency or public district, excluding aliens legally employed.
- 3102. (a) All disaster service workers shall, before they enter upon the duties of their employment, take and subscribe to the oath or affirmation required by this chapter.
- (b) In the case of intermittent, temporary, emergency or successive employments, then in the discretion of the employing agency, an oath taken and subscribed as required by this chapter shall be effective for the purposes of this chapter for all successive periods of employment which commence within one calendar year from the date of that subscription.
- (c) Notwithstanding subdivision (b), the oath taken and subscribed by a person who is a member of an emergency organization sanctioned by a state agency or an accredited disaster council, whose members are duly enrolled or registered with the Office of Emergency Services, or any accredited disaster council of any political subdivision, shall be effective for the period the person remains a member with that organization".

Therefore, the Board of Directors hereby declares the following items will be put in place for all employees of the Twentynine Palms water District:

- All employees shall contact their supervisor in the event of a disaster. All
 employees are to report to the District's main office, if phone contact is not available, if
 the main office is not functional, all employees are to report to the Fluoride Removal
 Plant.
- District staff is to ensure that there are supplies, i.e. Food, water, sanitary facilities, sleeping area's that can support the families of employees for 3 to 7 days.
- If an employee's home is inhabitable or the employee is concerned about the wellbeing of the family, living in his/her home, the employee is instructed to bring the family to the District's Emergency Operations Center (EOC).

- The EOC staff will appoint a shelter manager to help keep families safe and keep order in the shelter.
- Once the City of Twentynine Palms, County of San Bernardino or State of California opens an evacuation Center, all families will be moved to the evacuation center.
- If an emergency happens during normal business hours, employees are to remain at work. The District's Emergency Operations Center will release employees to ensure the safety of the employee's families living in the employee's household.
- All District staff will be supplied with a take home "Family Emergency Kit" which will support a family of 4 for 72 hours. These kits will include but not limited to the following items:
 - 4 survival blankets
 - 4 ponchos
 - First aid kit (107 piece)
 - Leather work gloves
 - 4 goggles
 - 4 NIOSH N-95 dust masks
 - Multi-function tool with pliers
 - 12-hour emergency snap lights
 - Emergency power station: four-function hand-crank unit that features a flashlight, AM/FM radio, cell phone charger and personal alarm
 - Emergency whistle
 - Emergency communication plan
 - Duct tape (10 yards)
 - Bio hazard bags
 - Food and water for 4 people
 - Waterproof matches

Family emergency kits are to be signed out by each employee. Each kit will remain the property of the Twentynine Palms Water District and are to be surrendered to the District upon termination of employment from the District.

The kits are for emergency purposes only. Any items used in non-emergency events will be billed to the employee.

Through training and education employees will be encouraged to also have the following items supplied at their own cost:

- Extra pair of eyeglasses
- Comfortable shoes
- Extra medications
- List of medications
- Potable water, a minimum of one gallon per person for day 7 days

- Family size tent
- Extra clothing (warm)
- Some cash
- Keep propane BBQ tank ½ full
- 20 hour candle
- Gas shut off tool
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Sanitary napkins
- Wet wipes
- Pet food

PLAN

BACKGROUND\DISCUSSION

An Emergency Response Plan (ERP) is a key document that will guide an agency through different emergency situations. Having an effective plan that meets regulatory guidelines not only prepares staff to deal with emergencies but also allows an agency to be eligible for reimbursement of funds used during an emergency.

The ERP is a requirement of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) through several Presidential Directives, the National Preparedness Plan, and the State of California through the Emergency Services Act.

In a review of the District's current ERP it was determined that it did not meet requirements of the National Incident Management System (NIMS), the Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) and did not follow the American Water Works Association (AWWA) G-440 Plan which outlines emergency preparedness practices.

The District has been working with Sierra West Consultants to make updates and revisions to the District's ERP to meet the necessary requirements of and adequate plan. An effective ERP will provide guidance to the District during emergency events and through comprehensive and continued training to staff be better prepared to deal with these emergencies.

RECOMMENDATION

To approve Resolution 16-13 adopting the Twentynine Palms Water District's Emergency Response Plan.

RESOLUTION NO. 16-13

A RESOLUTION OF THE TWENTYNINE PALMS WATER DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS ADOPTING AN EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

WHEREAS, the Twentynine Palms Water District is committed to protect the constituents of the District from potential harm from natural and human caused disasters or emergencies;

WHEREAS, the preservation of life, property, and the environment is an inherent responsibility of local, state and federal government;

WHEREAS, it is imperative the District plan and prepare for an effective and timely response and recovery effort, when emergencies and disasters occur;

WHEREAS, the Department of Homeland Security and the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (OES) require that all governmental entities within the state operate under a Standardized Emergency Management System (SEMS) and the National Incident Management System (NIMS) approved Emergency Response Plan (ERP);

WHEREAS, the Twentynine Palms Water District has developed an ERP that conforms to SEMS and NIMS;

WHEREAS, this ERP is an extension of the County of San Bernardino's Emergency Response Plan and the State of California Emergency Plan. It will be exercised yearly, staff will be trained as per the Training Section of the ERP and revised as necessary to meet changing conditions and requirements;

WHEREAS, upon adopting this Plan, the District is concurrently re-adopting the provisions of NIMS and SEMS;

WHEREAS, upon adoption of the 2016 ERP all other previous emergency plans are no longer valid;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

- The Board of Directors hereby adopts the Emergency Response Plan.
- 2. The Twentynine Palms Water District Board of Directors gives its full support to this plan and urges staff, employees to collectively to do their share in the emergency effort.

10.1 Operations

The District responded to 27 Underground Service Alerts, had 1 water main leak, 0 water meter leaks, 0 service line leaks, 1 fire hydrant repair, performed 2 customer pressure checks, replaced 14 meters, replaced 6 customer gate valves, and installed 2 new services. Water quality levels were normal for the

month. Water production was down 13% as compared to the same month in 2013. Treatment Plant loss was reduced from 3% to 1.6%. The District is awaiting response from the State Water Resource Control Board after submitting the District's "stress test" as formulated by the State Water Resource Control Board.

10.2 Finance

Ms. Byerrum reported that a recommendation to open an OPEB Trust will be brought to the Board. The transition to Pacific Western is going smoothly. The Audit will be conducted in September. The District is at 92% for water sales and expenses. A final closeout will be done for the Fire Department.

10.3 General Manager

Mr. Kolisz reported the District's Chromium 6 Compliance Plan was submitted and accepted by the State Water Resource Control Board. The public will be notified in accordance to compliance regulations. The Emergency Response Plant will be brought to the Board for approval next month. Pond 3 construction is completed. Directors Horn and Giannini were presented with Certificates of Completion for attending the CSDA Leadership Academy.

11. <u>Future Agenda Items and Staff Tasks/Directors' Comments and Reports</u>

Director Moore informed County Fire that the ponds at the Treatment Plant cannot be used to draft water by helicopter as damage to the ponds' liner can occur.

1. **ENGINEERING**

A. No items to report.

2. WATER QUALITY

- A. <u>Chlorine Levels</u>: Average levels maintained in the storage and distribution system ranged from a low of 0.09 mg/L to a high of 0.26 mg/L. Chlorination point (the point where chlorine is introduced into the distribution system) averages ranged from 0.21 mg/L to 0.55 mg/L.
- B. <u>Bacteria Samples</u>: A total of 38 routine bacteria samples were collected at test points for the storage and distribution system during this past month. In addition 8 special bacteria samples were collected. All routine and special samples indicated ABSENT for Collect.
- C. <u>Fluoride Samples</u>: A total of 16 fluoride samples were collected at established test points for the storage and distribution system, and 7 fluoride samples were taken from potable water production wells. Fluoride levels in the distribution system ranged from a low of 0.70 mg/L to a high of 2.4 mg/L. Fluoride measurements collected at the wells ranged from a low of 0.30 to a high of 2.4 mg/L.
- D. <u>General Physical</u>: A total of 10 general physical samples were collected from established locations as a part of routine testing requirements. Levels reported for color are <3, 1 for threshold odor and <0.1 for turbidity.
