SEPTEMBER 23, 2015 / 6:00 P.M.

Call to Order and Roll Call

President Moore called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., 72401 Hatch Road, Twentynine Palms, California. Those responding to roll call were Directors Carol Giannini, Suzi Horn, Sam Moore, and Roger Shinaver. Director Chancey Chambers was absent. Also present were General Manager Ray Kolisz, Financial Consultant Cindy Byerrum, and District Secretary Cindy Fowlkes.

Pledge of Allegiance

Director Moore led the pledge.

Rate Study Discussion and Possible Action

Financial Consultant, Cindy Byerrum, addressed the Board and pointed out several factors that have contributed to a loss of revenue in recent years making a rate increase necessary to ensure adequate reserves. Some of those factors included inflationary costs in utilities, unfunded state and federal mandates, and loss of revenue due to the state's 28% conservation mandate.

Two rate study alternatives were presented to the Board for consideration. The Board can choose to increase rates at a lower percentage from year to year as needed. Staff recommends approving Alternative #2 for a 6% rate increase. This will ensure the reserve level is met four out of the five years without a continuous draw down on reserves as would be the result with Alternative #1, a 5% increase.

Alternative #1

5% annual increase; setting aside the required annual contribution for unfunded retiree medical benefits; drawing down on reserves for the next four years but achieving recommended reserve levels in five years; after year five, reserves will fund operations and capital improvement needs.

Alternative #2

6% annual increase; setting aside the required annual contribution for unfunded retiree medical benefits; achieving recommended reserve level in all but one year in the first five years; building reserve levels thereafter.

Terry Hinderliter, of Twentynine Palms, questioned the reasoning behind a rate increase and spoke to the lack of rebates for grass removal.

Ed Vallerand, of Twentynine Palms, spoke in favor of a 6% rate increase and opposed the reduction in commercial meter rate charges.

Director Horn made a motion to approve Alternative #2, seconded by Director Giannini and approved by the following roll call vote:

2. <u>Urban Water Management Plan Update – Award Contract and Authorize General Manager to Execute Contract</u>

The Urban Water Management Plan must be updated every five years. Staff recommends awarding the contract to Kennedy/Jenks Consultants in the amount of \$59,940.00.

4. The Board of Directors Approve the Creation of a Wastewater Ad Hoc Committee
The Regional Water Quality Control Board is reviewing a collaborative Salt Nutrient
Management Plan and Wastewater Master Plan between the District and the City of
Twentynine Palms. An Ad Hoc committee will review the next steps associated with
these plans and address concerns by the Regional Water Quality Control Board.

Director Moore nominated Directors Horn and Chambers with Director Giannini as an alternate to sit on the Wastewater Ad Hoc committee, seconded by Director Shinaver and unanimously approved.

7. <u>Management Reports</u>

7.1 Operations

Mr. Kolisz introduced Mike Minatrea as the Operations Superintendent. The District responded to 32 Underground Service Alerts, had 0 water main leaks, 6 water meter leaks, performed 1 customer pressure check, replaced 13 customer gate valves, performed 5 leak audits, repaired 1 and painted 26 fire hydrants. Water quality levels were normal for the month. Water production is down 14.2% as compared to the same month in 2013. The District continues working to achieve the 28% conservation goal.

7.2 Finance

Ms. Byerrum reported that the budget is tracking as expected with revenues at 9%, continuing the downward trend from the prior year.

7.3 General Manager

Mr. Kolisz informed the Board that a new phone system has been installed. Customers are placed in a queue with calls answered in the order they are received. Senate Bill 385 was recently passed allowing the State Water Resource Control Board the authority to grant a chromium 6 variance at the request of a public water system as long as a compliance plan is prepared, submitted, and accepted by the state board and the system complies with notice and testing requirements. The District is working with the state to get wells 9 and 11, previously shut down due to chromium 6 non-compliance, back online.

8. <u>Future Agenda Items and Staff Tasks/Directors' Comments and Reports</u> Director Shinaver would like inactive meter charges placed on the agenda for discussion.

Director Giannini would like next month's agenda to include review of the emergency response plan.

9. Adjournment

On motion by Director Shinaver seconded by Director Horn and approved by the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 7:04 p.m.
